#### **GUEST ARTIST PROFILE**



Chicago native **Stephen Uhl** completed his Artist Diploma in Piano Performance in the Spring of 2017 at Chicago College of the Performing Arts at Roosevelt University where he studied with Adam Neiman. Prior to earning his Artist Diploma, he received his M.M. from the Chicago College of the Performing Arts, studying under Kuang-Hao Huang. His

playing has received critical acclaim from The Reporter as well as John von Rhein of the Chicago Tribune. In the Spring of 2017, he formed the Ostrega Uhl Project with violinist Brian Ostrega. The duo performs a wide range of repertoire, provides a platform for other young musicians, and strives to both educate and entertain their audiences. In Feburary of 2020, the duo released their first album, "50/50." They are anticipating their second commercial release in the near future.

Before moving back to Chicago, Uhl earned his undergraduate degree at Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, where he studied piano with Du Huang and collaborative piano with Jessica Paul. Uhl has appeared in masterclasses with Emanuel Ax, Christopher Taylor, Martin Katz, and Christopher Harding. Composers whose work Uhl has premiered and championed include Jake Runestad, the late Stephen Paulus, Jonathan Hannau, Heidi Joosten, Daniel Kallman, and Kurt Heinecke. Uhl frequently enjoys collaborating with singers, instrumentalists, and composers as well as performing a wide variety of improvised music. As pianist, organist, and chorister, Uhl has been heard on WFMT on multiple occasions. His improvisational journeys have taken him to places as diverse as the Curitiba Opera House, Copacabana Beach in Rio de Janeiro, in addition to multiple Chicago jazz venues. He has had the privilege of collaborating with improvisers including Mark Colby, Pharez Whitted, and Ben Dillinger.

Uhl is the Collaborative Artist at Elmhurst University. He enjoys working with Sarah Catt and Emma Castaldi in conjunction with the many choirs at Elmhurst.

An avid scholar of liturgical music, Uhl is the Organist at Baker United Methodist Church in St. Charles, where he collaborates with Jeff Hunt. As a complement to his interest in music for the church, Uhl was selected to participate in the WFMT Bach Organ Works Project, where

he performed several of the composer's works at Alice Millar Chapel. In September of 2018, Uhl played, and was on the discussion panel at the Association of Lutheran Church Musicians Midwest Regional Conference.

Uhl is the Collaborative Keyboard Artist for the Music Department at Glenbard East High School in Lombard, Illinois as the Collaborative Keyboard Artist. He enjoys working with the three curricular choirs, two chamber choirs, and vocal jazz ensemble. Additionally, he coaches vocalists and instrumentalists, and is always happy to assist with any music theory homework. Uhl coordinates the instrumentalists who join the choirs for their performances. When not practicing, rehearsing, or performing, Uhl enjoys cooking, lifting weights, strong coffee, reading, and reflecting. He strives to embody God's redeeming purpose for this world.

**Dr. Patrick O'Shea** (Director) holds the degree of Doctor of Musical Arts in Choral Music from Arizona State University, Master of Music degree in Choral Music from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, and Bachelor of Music degree, summa cum laude, in Vocal Performance from Shenandoah Conservatory in

Winchester, Va. His composition teachers have included the late Russell Woollen, as well as Thomas Fredrickson and Randall Shinn. He has served frequently as a clinician and adjudicator, and has been commissioned to write new works, particularly for choral and chamber music ensembles. Dr. O'Shea is a member of the American Choral Directors Association, the American Society of Composers Authors and Publishers, American Composers Forum, and Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia music fraternity.



Enjoying a national reputation as an accompanist, chamber musician, adjudicator and clinician, **William Buhr's** work as a collaborative pianist has taken him to performing engagements in over thirty countries on six continents. Buhr has served on the accompanying staff of the Chicago Symphony Chorus at the invitation of

founder/director Margaret Hillis, and has accompanied James Levine, Michael Tilson Thomas, Yo-Yo Ma, June Anderson, Berndt Weikl and others at the Ravinia Festival. He has also worked with Stephen Sondheim, Patti LuPone, Audra McDonald and Cerveris in the Ravinia Festival productions of *Sunday in The Park with George* and *Anyone Can Whistle*.

Holding degrees from the University of Illinois and DePaul University, Mr. Buhr has appeared in many international festivals as well as numerous national and regional conventions of major musical and educational organizations. Mr. Buhr has served on the faculty of the Choral Music Experience Institute for Choral Teacher Education with Doreen Rao since its inception in 1986, and has played for the national touring companies of numerous Broadway musicals including *Showboat*, Disney's *Beauty and the Beast*, and *The Phantom of the Opera*. He has served as the accompanist of the New Classic Singers since 1986, and has enjoyed an association with Anima - Young Singers of Greater Chicago (formerly the Glen Ellyn Children's Chorus) since 1984.

#### **DUPAGE CHORALE PROFILES**

**DuPage Chorale** is a college/community chorus that presents quality concerts of fine choral music. Its seasons present a broad range of literature ranging from oratorios to masses to operettas and musical theater. Through the years, members have found the joy of singing master works by composers like Bach, Handel, Mozart, Haydn, Beethoven, Brahms, Mendelssohn, Poulenc, Fauré, Copland and Bernstein. They have also explored major works in the jazz and popular idioms by Dave Brubeck, Duke Ellington, Gilbert & Sullivan, Kurt Weill, Rodgers and Hammerstein, and Lerner & Loewe. Members have explored time and space with music of the past and present and music from the corners of the globe. They toured Europe in 2000 and 2003. Most importantly, the members of the DuPage Chorale have learned the joys of communal singing in a supportive atmosphere that values them as individuals and as members of a community with shared goals and ideals. DuPage Chorale was the first music ensemble created at College of DuPage.
